Chicago, the West Side, North Lawndale, 24th Ward, gets a \$68 million dollar Project on site of Roosevelt Rd and Kostner Ave

Bringing a solar powered Industrial Complex, 700 jobs, a park and two Community Innovation Centers to Revitalize 21 Acres of neglected Westside vacant lots owned by the city

Once it was the site of an illegal dumping ground which made headlines as part of an FBI investigation on political corruption and became infamous as Operation Silver Shovel in the 1990s. The site also has been the recipient of unsuccessful attempts at redevelopment like the Obama Library. But now is finally receiving a turnaround as part of Mayor Lori Lightfoot's Invest South West initiative.

Mayor Lori E. Lightfoot, 24th Ward Ald. Monique Scott, and other elected officials broke ground on Related Midwest and 548 Development's plan to build an industrial complex housing freight, distribution and cold storage tenants. The development will include two community innovation centers (Black Men United and New Covenant Community Development Corporation), a rooftop solar farm and a park. The development promises to generate 700 permanent and temporary jobs and offer workforce training programs and business incubation space at 4300 W. Roosevelt Road in North Lawndale, as stated by Mayor Light.

Lightfoot began her presentation by saying, "I am grateful to Michael Scott, you need to standup sir and take a bow asking former 24th Ward Ald. Michael Scott to take a stand in appreciation for the part he played in championing the project to life when he was the 24th Ward Alderman."

INVEST South/West is Chicago Mayor Lori Lightfoot's strategy to revitalize the commercial cores of 10 underserved

community areas on the South and West Sides by allocating more than \$2.2 billion in public and private resources. This project was chosen out of six plans for the site at 4300 W Roosevelt Rd.

Stated Ald. Monique Scott, who introduced the Mayor, "I stand here this morning and of course I have a speech. But it is very astounding to see how many people are in support of this project and what was needed on the Westside. Today I don't have to defend the Westside. Instead I bear witness to the Roosevelt and Kostner Innovation Center project.

This project will change the face of the 24th Ward and add value. The planning for this project started in 2016 with former Ald. Michael Scott Jr, my brother, and in December 2022, the deal was sealed by me on my watch." Ald. Monique Scott remarked, "the current administration heard our cry," speaking of Mayor Lightfoot. This is just one of the projects under the city's Invest South West initiative targeted at the Westside.


This project will include 4 new buildings across the 21 acres. 363,520 square feet industrial center for freight, logistics and manufacturing. 40% of the project is MBE/WBE (Minority Black Enterprise/ Women Black Enterprise), a 1 plus acre public Park featuring Native Landscape Design.

Mayor Lightfoot remarked, "people left this community because they lost hope, they were tired of waiting for things to turn. When you have this permanent

construction here, showing that the needs of the westside are being met. Everyday people are going to drive by and say the seemingly impossible has been made possible...We got it done."

Black Men United will have a building with their name on it in bold letters.

Stated Pastor John Harrell, CEO of Black Men United, "we have a world class city, and represented by a world class mayor, because one thing that nobody ever says is that her and her administration did all of this wonderful stuff in the midst of a pandemic...We are a world class organization Black Men United, my brothers, we been fighting all of our lives."

Rodney Brown the CEO of New Covenant Community Development Corp. stated, "In our building, we are going to be celebrating Black History every month. We will be working with future history makers helping them understand how to create businesses that become legacy businesses."

Lightfoot highlighted a black artist, also working with the project. And to design the four new buildings, 548 Enterprise and Related Midwest collaborated with Lamar Johnson Collaborative, a full-service Chicago-based design and architecture firm for the design of the innovation centers. Chicago-based Ware Malcomb provided design services for the industrial center.



Vetress Boyce, Candidate for 24th Ward Alderman

Wants to reverse 50 years of disinvestment and implement strategies to address violence in Chicago

Vetress Boyce is a candidate for the 24th Ward Aldermanic seat. This is her third election bid for the position. Her 1st run was in 2011, where she placed third. In 2015, she placed second in the election forcing another runoff. She is banking on her third time being the charm.

Mrs. Boyce has an extensive 25-year history in working in the corporate field. Beginning in 1987, She began as a secretary and worked her way up to Vice President of Operations before retiring in 2012. In the midst of her corporate career she became a developer in the Bronzeville neighborhood.

Ms. Boyce wants to implement strategies to address violence in Chicago. Stated Mrs. Boyce, "When you look at violence across the City of Chicago and you look at the root cause, the root cause is poverty. In order to address poverty, we have to immediately partner with the city. The city has started the infrastructure of economic improvement and development, businesses, housing, homeownership, as well as rental units." She also mentioned implementing quality education facilities, schools and after school facilities with more programs to get our youth engaged.

"Until we get that strategy solid...and let our youth know that we hear your cry. Violence will continue. We have to start implementing classes where we deal with trauma. Our kids deal with trauma every day and it's not getting any better. That trauma is infusing crime. Contracting is being conducted by young children. 12, 13, and 15. Those are the ones that are also doing the carjacking. Until we minimize the blight in our community it will continue. Until we make trauma classes part of the educational curriculum it will continue."

She wants to sit down with the Chicago Teachers Union, the Chicago Public Schools and other Aldermanic colleagues, once elected, to understand what is it going to take to change the trajectory of the Westside and the Southside of Chicago where it has been completely disinvested in for over 50 years. She wants to get together and pull the resources working collectively with the State Rep., the congressman, the senator and others, sitting at the table.

Mrs. Boyce says because of disinvest over the years, reparations can play a key part in reversing the disinvestment. Getting less than 1% of contracts, and getting the smallest percentage of the Invest South West and Neighborhood Opportunity Fund grants reversing it so that we have own pot to pull resources from to help our people directly.

To empower and value community engagement, Mrs. Boyce says, "I make it my business to talk to the residents." What is it that your missing? Why aren't you getting the information. She says that she is not getting emails as it relates to certain events that are going on in the community. She wants to open up that gateway and give everybody access to the information. She says that being fair and equitable across the board and transparency is key."



Wants North Lawndale revitalized and doing more to restore hope and attractiveness to the ward

Drewone Goldsmith is an aldermanic candidate of the 24th ward dedicated to uplifting the North Lawndale community he has called home for over 50 years. "You took the belt out of our hands and prayers out of the school. Things are going to get bad" is a memory from his grandmother motivating him into the political arena.

He presently serves North Lawndale as an instructor in the Chicago Fire Department, training its new recruits in the necessary skills to perform the task of firefighting.

When asked what he does, he replied, "In serving as a Lieutenant of the Chicago Fire Department, I train individuals to become fire fighters through instilling discipline in them, and helping them to become service driven people with empathy enough to truly care for the city's neediest citizens."

Mr. Goldsmith has been in the fire department for 22 years, reaching the rank of Lieutenant after 18. He left high school and enrolled in the U.S. Marines and has been stationed in a few exotic places, like San Diego, Oklahoma, Hawaii, Japan, Burkina Faso in Northwest Africa, and Brazil in addition to fighting in Desert Storm.

Speaking about the needs of North Lawndale, Mr. Goldsmith said, "Obviously crime is not only plaguing our ward and city, but the entire nation as well. There seems to be a lack of intentionality in our ward that breaks down the neighborhood."

Addressing the needs of North Lawndale even more, he cited the lack of cleanliness and said "There are a lot of things that hinder social progress. I've already started to network with the community on a small scale by asking neighbors to work together by taking an hour before school to come out to see the children and engage with them by just saying hello and doing the same in the evenings."

"Doing this shows the youth we are a community and we care about one another." He then turned the conversation to something

that he feels is a great tool for uniting the community, which is the block club. "If a club exists then it's easy to get people involved. If there isn't one, it is not too difficult to start one with a few neighbors from a block."

"I've been pushing the ring door bells with the camera to be purchased by community members to use to help each other look out for their neighbor. The city will reimburse the resident for the purchase. This shows we are working together to make the community safer" said Mr. Goldsmith as he advocated the technology to help prevent crime, to make North Lawndale safer.

As president of the historic route 66 Classic Car Show, he has helped to highlight the beauty of North Lawndale with an event that draws 2,500 to 5,000 visitors to the neighborhood annually.

There were 50 booths offering job recruitment from the police, trade schools, also a kids pavilion for fun, and entrepreneurs seeking others to participate in business ventures. There were food vendors of course, and the main attraction was 200 cars.

"Cleaning up the ward is more than esthetics, it is psychological, and we need to have more mental health services to offset what is happening to our children and us."

Our children must be considered as our legacy, and when individuals from the community start to take pride and take

ownership in the community, it is a sign of hope," he said.

Ending the interview, he commented, "I continue to utilize the inner man of integrity. I'm not looking for back door or any personal deals. I'm doing this for my community.

I care, I truly want North Lawndale revitalized, and we can do much better than we are actually doing now, and we can restore hope and attractiveness to ward 24.

One last thing I'd like to mention; during Hurricane Katrina in 2005 I led two trips to New Orleans taking vital supplies like clothing food and water. We also collected and distributed about \$7,000 dollars from North Lawndale to help with the relief efforts.

On my second trip, four contractors including myself with 5 laborers returned to the city and worked restoring a few building belonging to a local church ministry.

When there is a need, we should come together to help one another. That's what I learned from the response in helping with Hurricane Katrina.

No one knows the heart of a man, and I'm hopeful and passionate about revitalizing our community. That's why I am running for Alderman, to build upon the hidden greatness of the 24th ward." For more info visit his website at www.goldsmitfighting424ward.com.

Simeon Henderson Candidate for District 10 Council

Motivational speaker, actor, and former policeman, Simeon Henderson is running for a position on District 10's Council. This position is newly created and involves three people elected in regular municipal elections every four years, starting in February 2023.

Their duties are to work with the police on plans of community concerns and importance about policing in the district they serve. The 10th district position covers North Lawndale, Little Village, and the Pilsen communities.

Addressing accountability of the police and increasing the overall safety of the neighborhoods they will represent is the primary role of the council member. This will be achieved by holding monthly meetings where the council member will speak directly with residents from the community.

In addition, the responsibility for the council representative will be to coordinate and connect with law enforcement officials the needs of the community in response to restorative justice. The work with restoring justice to the community falls into development of initiatives that are agreed upon by the community and shared with law enforcement to maximize the success of proposed responses called for by the residents of the district.

Mr. Henderson is a lifelong resident of Chicago and has a background in law enforcement. He served as a Chicago Police officer for 6 yrs before deciding to become

an educator.

"As a policeman it was my duty to serve and protect the neighborhood I patrolled. I worked the 21st District for 6 years and realized that I couldn't do the work I needed to do as an officer to help my community and that is why I went into education."

Resigning from the police force in 2004, he subsequently obtained a Master's Degree as an Instructor in Leadership in education that led him to become a motivational speaker.

Previously, Mr. Henderson has worked as an Assistant Athletic Coach at Providence St. Mel for the 95-96 seasons, a Dean of Students in High School and he has functioned as a math, reading, social studies and science teacher in grades 5, 7, and 8th and taught at the and college level as well and about education, he said, "The value of education to me is this, I've always said get your education, no one can take away two things from you; that is education and your heart"

Growing up on Chicago's Westside, he said was "faced with gangs, drugs and violence" in his youth. Coming from a background of a family that believed in attending church, and having a great-grandfather and grandfathers on his mother and father's side of the family as "Baptist Minister's" gave him inspiration to avoid becoming a statistic of the criminal justice system.

Mr. Henderson is an actor, an author and engages his community by speaking to youth. In 2017, he published "Through The Eyes Of A Man" his autobiography which he calls episodes of his life that are BESIMBOLIC LESSONS and stated, "Through The Eyes of a Man" was written to show others that they can be successful and win despite the odds. No matter how a situation is perceived you have to believe that you are victorious and that, "You have the final say in your life!"

Lastly, Mr. Henderson just completed the season as the coach of The Ogden International Lady Owls Varsity Basketball Team who won their first ever Sectional City Championship. The race for the council is on the slate with Kiisha Smith and Leo Guzman.



Creative Scott for Alderman

"When the campaign is over, I'll continue the work I'm doing which is advocating for the residents in my community. An alderperson's role should legislate, advocate, appropriate and investigate" is how Creative Scott explained why he should be elected as the North Lawndale Community's alderman.

"Legislate is drafting new laws to better the community, making a change for the better," adding, "One of the bills I would seek to enact would be to ask for an increase of the menu money, that is allotted to the wards. It went up from 1.3 to 1.5 million, and it needs to increase, because it's not enough to bring about the proper changes needed in our community."

Advocate he addressed in the following, "For my community we could bring laws to improve the infrastructure, like bringing more lighting to the bus stops. There are 18,000 bus stops in the city, and in our neighborhood, we need to get something like a security box near the stop to contact authorities for help with crime prevention, because there is too much darkness at the bus and rail stops." To Advocate is speaking on behalf of the community you represent.

Defining appropriation, he said, "To appropriate is to stand firm and go after funding for a particular use, and in our neighborhood, there has been very little investment, and I'm running for alderman because I see the lack of investment in our community."

Mr. Scott focused on investment with these words, "If a constituent comes and requests services for getting rid of a pot hole, it would not be a problem for me to go out check and follow up to see that it was handled properly." He then turned to Tax Increment Financing or TIF for short by saying, "In my opinion, there are two communities named Lawndale, North of Ogden does not look like South of Ogden, but both pay taxes. One looks impoverished and the other doesn't."

Having been a business owner in the community for over 30 years and helping others become employed in positions like barbers, nail techs, as well as his salon being a safe haven for youth, he's planning a July 4th celebration for the community.

He also reminisced about his involvement with the Lawndale Black Chamber of Commerce advancing to being its president, and the Lawndale Business Local Development Corporation (LDLBC) that helped him become involved with the Illinois Black Chamber of Commerce and lobby in Springfield for neighborhood funding.

Toys are another memorable connection Mr. Scott relishes talking about, as last Christmas, he provided over \$20,000 dollars in toys, appliances and tools for adults and children with the help of Eric Strickland and other businesses.

The toy drive has a 20 year history and he even distributes Turkeys' for Thanksgiving. Mr. Scott is also a Public Safety Firearm Instructor and Training Counselor accredited through the National Rifle Association and the United States Concealed Carry Association.

Gun Problems and Solutions is the business concern where he teaches a 16 hour course that helps with "Situation Awareness" which teaches how to react in a dangerous situation. He works with churches; attorneys' and clients seeking to reintegrate into society. He teaches people how to become legally able to carry firearms and is a strong proponent of the second amendment. Creative also teaches how to defend yourself without the use of a firearm as well. With martial arts and other

use of weapons and various ways of de-escalation.

Creative worked with the late Robert Steele in an anti bullying campaign. Early in the COVID19 pandemic he worked with Lashon K. Ford and entertainer Twista distributing hand sanitizer, and masks to seniors and young people and previously was a martial arts teacher of self defense at Legacy Charter School. "I want to build and create wealth in the community" were his final words.
